# Welcome!



**Welcome to the climate camp in the Leipzig region!  
We're happy you are here!**

## **What is a climate camp?**

A climate is a space to connect and discuss, offering wide learning opportunities including workshops, panels and field trips. You get the chance to discover and discuss the problems and challenge of the climate justice movement and to find and realize alternatives and solutions with many other people.

The climate camp in the Leipzig region is a grass-root democratically organized process in which people from many different contexts take part in. Beyond that, the camp is a place of living alternatives in which you can participate actively: care work, such as cooking and cleaning, is done by everyone and important decisions are made by consensus. We live vegan and with a careful use of resources.

## **Why are we here in Pödelwitz?**

The climate camp is organized in cooperation with active people from the region whose villages are threatened by coal. Following the plans of MIBRAG (Mitteldeutsche Braunkohlengesellschaft mbH; the company responsible), the village is supposed to become a part of the mine. In doing so, not only this place is supposed to be destroyed. The burning of coal is the most climate-damaging (and also destroying) way of producing energy. In the power

plants of MIBRAG, RWE and LEAG, the climate is getting burned. For their profit, livelihoods get destroyed here and elsewhere! That's enough! Together with the people of Pödelwitz, we want to develop perspectives for a structural change. Because global climate justice starts in Pödelwitz.

## **A special highlight of our camp: The Degrowth Summer School**

The climate camp hosts the Degrowth Summer School from July 29th till August 2nd. The previous three times, it took place on the Rhineland camp. The focus was on the connections of the discourses about climate justice and degrowth. In a world with restricted resources, endless growth is not possible. It leads to social and ecological inequality and speeds up climate change. To establish climate justice, we need an economy that provides a good life for all.

During the summer school, we want to develop pathways and visions for such an economy and society. Detailed information about the courses, panels and the program of the summer school can be found in the separate print program.

Despite its „young“ age, it emits high volumes of mercury, nitrogen- and sulphur oxides, heavy metals and respirable dust. We take a look at all this. (Overall 10 km.)

## **Bike tour to places of forced labour in Böhlen**

The town of Böhlen was one a center of forced labor in the surrounding area of Leipzig. For Saturday, some groups have already prepared some activities: in the region of Pödelwitz a bike demonstration and a blockade by the group "Kohle erSetzen"; in Leipzig, the bicycle "Tour de Natur" will visit various actors of climate change. More demonstrations might be registered beforehand. All of these can be used as docking points for various action forms.

Before the climate camp, the regional initiatives for climate justice and the local initiative of Poedelwitz discussed about the right escalation level in the current situation of the region. More information about the action frame will be available on the camp.

Contact point for your actions and information about the action day in the camp will be the "Pödelwitz bleibt"-tent.
